# What is an instruction mode?

- Instruction Mode refers to the manner in which typical classroom activities involving instructors and students are provided, such as lectures, discussions and group engagement.
- Instruction Mode does not refer to out-of-class requirements such as homework, reading, studying, writing assignments, take-home examinations or similar.

# Instruction Modes for students planning to be in Ithaca

<b>In Person with transition to Online</b>	<u>Begin in person instruction, during schedule meeting times, which continues through Thanksgiving, followed by online instruction for all students through the end of the semester.</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Example: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>All students attend in-person through Thanksgiving, followed by online instruction for all students through end of the semester.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>	Only students located in Ithaca area can enroll
<b>Hybrid – Online &amp; In Person</b>	Content that <u>combines in person, scheduled classroom instruction with online learning.</u> Begin in person, with <u>rotational attendance</u> , which continues through Thanksgiving, followed by online instruction for all students through the end of the semester. <u>Some in person activity is required.</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Example: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>All students rotating in-person attendance through Thanksgiving (e.g. split by last name), followed by online instruction for all students through end of the semester.</li> <li>Students will receive rotational attendance information from academic department once details are determined.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>	Only students located in Ithaca area can enroll
<b>Online</b>	<u>Content that is delivered completely online</u> , with portions delivered synchronously at a <u>prescheduled course meeting time</u> . There is not a physical classroom. Students in the Ithaca area will be expected to take in person examinations.	No restrictions, unless specified by academic department
<b>Distance Learning Asynchronous</b>	All students and instructors interact online. Involves well-designed, pre-recorded content and curated asynchronous interaction. Content is accessed by students at <u>unspecified times</u> .	No restrictions, unless specified by academic department
<b>Directed Research</b>	Research work supervised by an advisor or faculty member. Delivery varies by student.	No restrictions, unless specified by academic department
<b>Independent Studies</b>	Research work supervised by an advisor or faculty member. Delivery varies by student.	No restrictions, unless specified by academic department

# Instruction Modes for students not planning to be in Ithaca

<b>Remote Access</b>	Remote access class meetings will be scheduled for most <u>In Person</u> , <u>In Person with transition to Online</u> , and <u>Hybrid</u> class meetings as a supplementary enrollment option for students unable to attend in person class meetings.	Only students not located in the Ithaca area can enroll
<b>Online</b>	<u>Content that is delivered completely online</u> , with portions delivered synchronously at a prescheduled course meeting time. There is not a physical classroom. Students in the Ithaca area will be expected to take in person examinations.	No restrictions, unless specified by academic department
<b>Distance Learning Asynchronous</b>	All students and instructors interact online. Involves well-designed, pre-recorded content and curated asynchronous interaction. Content is accessed by students at <u>unspecified times</u> .	No restrictions, unless specified by academic department
<b>Directed Research</b>	Research work supervised by an advisor or faculty member. Delivery varies by student.	No restrictions, unless specified by academic department
<b>Independent Studies</b>	Research work supervised by an advisor or faculty member. Delivery varies by student.	No restrictions, unless specified by academic department

Only students not located in the Ithaca area can enroll
